## Project work in Nepal, by Sophie Maliphant

Gina one of our TB members has a daughter called Sophie who has given us the following information in her project work.

The Country that Shook is a charitable project that began after the 7.9 Richter earthquake in Nepal in April 2015. Its mission is to empower Nepali people to live fulfilled lives by providing education and resources.

The initial funds were raised with an illustrated children's book by project creator Sophie Maliphant and paid for a school to be rebuilt in Solukhumbu district. The book continues to be the heart of the project and has been joined by other creative fundraising initiatives which support buying fundamental school equipment and an inspirational menstruation campaign.

Last week, Sophie went with a team of people to the south of Nepal to hold a workshop teaching women to make reusable sanitary towels. They also provided a basic feminine hygiene lesson, information about the bigger picture with water sanitation and a creative exercise to break down the taboos around menstruation.
